Fire Department **BE TREE SAFE**

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.

PICKING THE TREE

• Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk and ad water to the tree stand.
- Make sure the tree is at *youtube.com/ChampionsE* least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, space heaters, candles, heat vents or incandescent lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Keep your (real) tree watered daily.

LIGHTING THE TREE

 Use lights that have the label of an independent testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use. *Never* use lit candles to decorate the tree.

- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

AFTER CHRISTMAS

• Get rid of the tree after Christmas. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage or placed outside against the house. Check with your local community to find a recycling program. Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- Nearly one of every three home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes roughly one in every four of the fires.

residents was that more tickets needed to be written to correct some problem issues. The constable's office has responded. On November 7, 14 tickets were written, primarily to Greenwood Residents who were violating traffic laws.

On November 7, our community met in a special meeting called to hear about the proposed changes to the intersection at Champion Forest Drive. We had about 150 residents who came to voice their concerns to representatives from Mr. Cagle's office. Lindsey Trahan did a fantastic job of giving us background on the project and how the Jack Cagle and Sam Harless have "gone to bat" for our neighborhood. She also expressed her surprise that about 10% of the neighborhood turned out; generally, she doesn't see this much participation and was impressed.

Lindsey is going to report back to Mr. Cagle on the homeowners' concerns and homeowners' proposed change to light timing to prevent the need for any extension of the existing left turn lane. We did not get a commitment to permanently stop the project at this point, however, the discussion continues as we await additional information.

One of our residents has made the required formal request to "provide data to support the extension of turn lanes on the Northbound side of Champion Forest Drive to FM 1960", another made a written request for a copy of the notes to be given to Jack Cagle's office by Lindsey Trahan.

We do have a commitment to slow down the schedule and a considerable downsizing of the number of turn lanes TxDOT will construct. Most of our landscaping, the trees, and our Greenwood Forest monument will be saved due to Mr. Cagle's efforts on our behalf. As a point of information, the HOA Board requested a representative from Jack Cagle's office come to speak to us.

DEBRIS CAN CAUSE CLOGGING OF STORM DRAINS.

When storm drains (also known as catch basins) clog with leaves and/or other debris, water can no longer drain from the street. This water can them pool along streets and flood intersections and homes.

Contrary to popular belief, pet wastes, oil and other materials dumped into catch basins do not go to the wastewater treatment plant, but instead flow directly into streams and rivers. Dumping debris and other material into the storm drain is not only illegal, but contributes to pollution of our waterways and causes localized flooding.

How should I dispose of leaves and debris?

When you are clearing your sidewalk or driveway, please do not rake or blow the leaves from you yard into the street. One option would be to sweep, collect, and bag grass clipping and leaves. Another option is to blow grass clipping back onto the lawn where they can become a mulch and a natural fertilizer. Further, consider raking or blowing leaves/debris into a compost pile, where they can decompose.

NINE TIPS TO KEEP PACKAGES SAFE DURING THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Greenwood Forest is always filled with the sounds of delivery trucks, but over the next few weeks deliveries will be doubled if not tripled. "Tis the season," after all. UPS, FedEx, and the US Postal Service (USPS) have all stated they expect another busy holiday season.

With all the packages being delivered, it's inevitable that some will be stolen from front porches or other delivery areas. While there's more to the season than gifts, it's frustrating if thieves target your house or neighborhood. Here are some tips that may help keep your packages safe.

1. Don't let your packages sit. Track your packages so you know when they should arrive. Leaving parcels on porches or in mailboxes overnight or for a couple of days is an open invitation to thieves. This holiday season track your holiday packages very closely.

2. Talk to your neighbors. If you have neighbors who are home during the day, consider asking them to collect your packages on the delivery date. More than likely, they'll be willing to help which can eliminate some holiday stress for you.

3. Ship to an alternate address. Depending on where you work, your company may allow you to ship your packages directly to your place of business. Check with management to see if this is acceptable. In addition, consider shipping your packages to a friend or relative's home.

4. *Ship to the store.* Some retailers allow you ship to a store near you. While this isn't as convenient, it does provide security and helps avoid long lines at the register. Some stores even offer special parking near the entrance.

5. *Hi-tech solutions*. If you order numerous packages all year round, it may be wise to invest in technology-based solutions. Examples of this may include mobile apps, security cameras, or services such as Package Guard.

6. Install a package lockbox. If you have deliveries showing up daily you may want to consider installing a lockbox. These boxes can be bolted to your front porch. Once installed, share your code with your delivery service and you should be good to go.

7. *Signature on delivery*. Consider having your packages delivered only when someone is available to sign for them.

8. Insure your holiday packages. Because package theft increases around the holidays, it may be wise to insure your packages this time of year. This way, if your package is stolen, you can be reimbursed for your loss.

9. Ship to your local pack and ship store. If you have a UPS, FedEx, or other locally owned packing and shipping store nearby, consider sending your packages there.

I hope that implementing one of these safety techniques can give you peace of mind during this hectic holiday season.
