1. 11,500 Acre community
2. 20 years left in residential building
3. 30 years left in commercial building
4. 900 Acres of Lakes and Parks
5. 60 miles of walking trails as of now. Once Bridgeland is complete there will be 200 miles of walking trails
6. Heated lap pool open year round
7. Dog Park
8. Tree House – “One of the most adventurous elements in Hidden Creek is Treehouse Park. This beautiful area features a two-story treehouse nestled among live oaks that date back to the property’s early rice farming days. Adjacent to the custom-built piece, a boardwalk hovers over an old creek bed and a decomposed granite pathway winds through the wooded area nearby. The remainder of the park will be left in its natural state, one of Bridgeland many efforts to preserve and restore its land, which is located in the Katy Prairie.”
9. Water Haven Park – “Water Haven Park is a three-acre site that offers several active play spaces, including a spray ground with a tall custom water tower structure and low-profile bubbling sculptures. Anchoring the spray ground is a pavilion that offers picnic tables and close proximity to barbecue grills.”
10. Soccer Fields, baseball fields, Tennis Courts, Basketball Courts
11. All home sites are in walking distance to green areas.
12. Food Truck Friday’s-Every 2nd Friday Food Trucks come to Bridgeland
13. Farmers Market – Every 2nd Sunday Bridgeland has their monthly Farmers Market
14. Nature Trails
15. Festival Park- “this three-acre park contains a covered pavilion used for concerts, Movies in the Park and other events. The pavilion offers restrooms and a seating area with a fireplace that residents use for a multitude of events.”
16. Fishing – 400 acres of lakes stocked in 2007 with nearly 300,000 fish including catfish, blue cat, brim and spotted bass. Catch and release of course.

18. Each community will have its own Village Center with a future Town Center that will be adjacent to the Grand Parkway and the hub of activity for the whole community.
