

2203 Kane; lot 7, block 395

On September 25, 1883 W. R. Baker sells lots 6 and 7 to Adolphus Schuppan for \$381. A vendor's lien is retained to secure a note for \$206 due 18 months after date. (28/406)

In the 1884-85 city directory Adolph Schuppan is a carpenter in the H. & T. C. shops and he resides on the southeast corner of Kane and Hemphill ("se cor Kane, Hemphill"). "se" is probably a mistake in the directory; "se" should be "sw". In 1886-87 he resides at 125 Kane between Hemphill and Taylor.

On November 17, 1887 Adolph Schuppan and Amelia Schuppan of Corsicana, Navarro Co., Texas sell lots 6 and 7 "together with house and all improvements thereon" to James McGee for \$650 cash. (39/419)

On November 17, 1887 James McGee sells lots 6 and 7 with the improvements thereon to William Pasche for \$100 and 37 promissory notes aggregating \$636.50. (39/431)

William Pasche:

In the 1870 census William Pasche (10) is one of 6 children living on a farm in Harris Co. with their parents Fritz Pasche (35, Prussia, farmer) and Phillippine Pasche (24, Nassau Capel). Among the other children are his older brother Fritz (11) and his younger brother Ludwig (5). In 1880 the parents have those 6 children and 6 more. The father is a stockman.

William Pasche married Hedwig Hafer April 9, 1884. He is in city directories for the first time in 1886-87. He is a carpenter in the H. & T. C. shops and lives at 16 Henderson corner Union. In 1887-88 he is a carpenter in the H. & T. C. shops and lives on the east side of Heiss (now Colorado) between Washington and Bismarck. In 1889-90 he lives at 125 Kane corner Hemphill. He works for H. & T. C. for many years. In the 1900

census William Pasche (39, M16, Tx, carpenter, OFH) lives at 2203 Kane with his wife Hetwig (35, M16/3/2, Germany, 1882), and 2 children Fred (14) and Lizzie (14). In 1910 William Pasche (48, M1/26, Tx, coach builder/railroad, OFH) and Hattee (45, M1/26/3/2, Germany) live at 2207 Kane and 2203 Kane is rented. City directories do not indicate that they ever lived at 2207 Kane; I believe the census taker made a mistake and reversed the addresses. In 1920 William Pasche (58, Tx, foreman/railroad shops, OF), Hedwig (56, Germany), and a granddaughter live at 2203 Kane. In 1930 William Pasche (69, M25, Tx, foreman/Railroad C___, O\$3000), his wife Hattie (64, M19, Germany, 1892 Na), their granddaughter, and their daughter Elizabeth McNeal (43, Wd) live at 2203 Kane. Miss Lizzie Pasche married J. J. McNeal March 29, 1906.

William Pasche continues to live at 2203 Kane until his death February 15, 1936. His wife lives there until her death May 13, 1937; they are buried in the Magnolia Cemetery. In city directories Mrs. Elizabeth McNeal is the resident owner of 2203 Kane from 1937-38 until about 1957. In the 1940 census Elizabeth McNeal (53, Wd, O\$3000) and 1 lodger live at 2203 Kane. On November 7, 1958 Mrs. Elizabeth Teresa McNeal married James Zenith Fuller. She died as Elizabeth Theresa Fuller, widow on July 7, 1965 and is buried in the Magnolia Cemetery as Elizabeth Pasche Fuller.

Elizabeth probably ceased to live at 2203 Kane at about the time she remarried. I have been unable to find a sale by her in the deed records or a purchase by Louis V. Colca, but the 1974 deed cited below suggests that he bought it from her in the late 1950's.

The 1896 Sanborn map does not show the south side of the 2200 block of Kane. The 1907 map shows a rectangular 1 1/2 story house on lot 7 at 2203 Kane with an attached porch, an additional room projecting from the back, and a service porch east of the back room. Lot 7 is wider than lot 8. In 1924 and in 1950 the house is the same. In 1950 it is asbestos clad.

The 1887 deeds cited above indicate that there was a house on lots 6 and 7 in 1887, although the selling price was not much above the normal price of unimproved land. In 1889-90 William Pasche is living at 125 Kane corner Hemphill. The current house on lot 7 was built in 1894. On March 3, 1894 Wm. Pasche and wife Hedwig Pasche contract with A. F. W Gaedke to construct before May 10, 1894 a 1-story frame cottage house on lot 7 for which Pasche promises to pay \$1400 on or before completion

(5/78, Harris Co. Contract Records). A. F. W. Gaedke was a railroad carpenter who lived at 1918 State St.

In 1892 William Pasche purchased lot 8. Prior to building his new house on lot 7 in 1894 he probably moved the existing house on lot 7 onto lot 8, presumably as a tenant house. A line on the 1907 map probably represents a fence that Pasche built between the two houses in such a way as to include part of lot 8 in his yard at the expense of his tenant's yard. This division was formalized in 1922 when he sold the west 44' of lot 8.

William Pasche bought lots 6 and 7 in 1887, but he sold lot 6 in 1890 to J. F. Pasche, who is his older brother Fritz.

Louis V. Colca:

As mentioned above Louis Colca probably purchased lot 7 in the late 1950's.

Louis Vincent Colca married Miss Frances Jo Danna February 14, 1939 in Harris Co. In the 1940 census they are living with her parents on Andrews St. He is 30 years old and a butcher. He died in 1962 at age 52; the death certificate states that he was a retired owner of a meat market. His wife died in 1963. It seems obvious that the grantors in the 1974 deed cited below are their children and heirs. That deed conveys two other lots in the Sixth Ward: 2009 Decatur where Colca operated a washateria and 2108/2106 Lubbock.

On May 24, 1974 Louis V. Colca, Jr. and Danna Colca, not joined by their wives, and Gerald Colca, a single man, sell lot 7 and the adjacent 6' of lot 8 in block 395 and 2 other lots to Richard B. Merrill, Jr. (104-06-1434)
