County of Bastrop. - WHEREAS, on the 13th day of October, A.D. 1887, a partition deed of filed in the county clerk's office of the county of Bastrop and the Spate of Texas, wherein Magdaline Meuth was to receive 120 7/10 acres out of the John S. Graft league in Bastrop County, Texas; said 120 7/10 acres being tract number two out of the 575 1/4 acre tract therein mentioned. Said partition deed being mentioned in cause number 185, styled Magdaline Meuth VS. Antonette Meuth, all of which may be found in Vol. 11, pages 194-195 of the deed records of Bastrop County, Texas, to which reference is hereto made for a perfect description of said 120 7/10 acres.

AND, WHEREAS, on the 17th day of June ...D. 1913, in Vol. L. pages 10-11 and 12 of the civil Minutes of the District Court of Bastrop County, Texas, in cause styled Cunter VS. Rabel, number 5507, a partition deed and agreement was entered into by and between said parties whereby Lena Segal, Joseph Segal, Andrew Segal, Annie Segal and George Segal were to receive an equal undivided interest in and to 156ml/10 acres out of the John S. Craft league in Bastrop County, Texas.

AND, WHEREAS, the Magdaline wouth above men tioned as receiving 120 7/10 acres, is the mother of the said Len a Segal, Joseph Segal, Andrew Segal, Annie Segal and George Segal the partis mentioned as receiving an undivided equal interest in and to the 156 7/10 acres.

MHEREAS, the said Magdaline Meuth, mother of the above named children and the owner of the 120 7/10 acres is now dead, having died intestate and without leaving a surviving husband; he, George Segal Sr, having died prior to his wife, Magdaline Meuth- Segal; and whereas the said George Segal, Sr, having died intestate.

AND, WHEREAS, the above named Lens Segal Joseph Segal, Andrew Segal, Annie Segal and George Segal, are the children of and only children born of the said Magdaline Meuth, wh

o afterwards married George Segal, Sr. All of the above named children, with the exception of Lena Segal, are now living. That at the time of the death of the said Lena Segal, she had no des cendants, she having never been married and no child having ever been born to her.

and, Whereas, it is the desire and intention of the four surviving children to partition among themselves the two above described tracts of lands, to-wit: the 156 1/10 acre and the 120 7/10 acre tracts, so that George Segal and Andrew Segal will each receive a tract of land containing 92.2 acres and Joseph Segal and Annie Segal Behrens will receive an equal undivided interest in and to a tract of land containing 92.2 acres.

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRES
ENTS, that we Joseph Segal and wife, Martha Segal; Andrew Segal
and wife, Lizzie Segal; Annie Segal- Behrens and her husband,
Max Behrens, of the county of Beatrop and the State of Texas, for
and in consideration of the sum of ONE DOLLAR, cash to me in hand
paid and for the consideration and purpose above mentioned, to us
in hand paid by George Segal, have granted, sold and conveyed, and
by these presents do grant, sell and convey unto the said George
Segal, all of our right, title and interest and equity that we
may now have or may hereafter have in and to all that certain tr
act or parcel of land lying and being situated in Beatrop County,
Texas, a part of the John S. Craft league, and described by metes
and bounds as follows: to-wit:

Beginning at the south corner of the above described tract "B": thence south 60 E. 651 varas to a corner on side of rocky hill with a tract of 155 acres owned by Rabel: thence North 30 E. with Rabels line 800 varas to a rock at his north corner; thence North 60 West with the Seidel estate, 651 varas to east corner of tract "B" as above described; Thence S. 30 W with same, 800 varas to the point of beginning, containing 92.2 acres.
A plat of said tracts of lands are attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes.
