

## Upgrades and features

Main House (Built in 1858, with kitchen extension added in late 1800s; laundry room/half bath, mudroom/office, and garage added in 2020)

- 1. All windows have been replaced with energy efficient double-paned windows
- All new wiring, plumbing and HVAC. New roof
- 3. Hot water on demand and mini-split HVAC systems to reduce utility costs
- 4. All toilets are new and raised for comfort
- 5. Entire house was raised one foot to improve access and airflow under house
- 6. Front hall/foyer has original flooring, stairs, and bannister
- 7. Front hall/foyer has storage room under stairs
- 8. Master bedroom has original wood floor and ceiling with operating wood fireplace
- 9. Master bathroom has double vanities with touch light mirrors
- 10. Master bathroom has custom shower with linear drain
- 11. Living room has antique wood floors that are not original. Wood ceiling is original.
- 12. Living room has operating wood fireplace
- 13. Second floor bedrooms have original floors and ceilings
- 14. All new second floor bathroom with venting and touch light mirror
- 15. Second floor fireplace is not operational. Brick in firebox is from original fireplace and placed to show historical manufacturers of brick used in fireplace over time
- 16. Kitchen has all new appliances including refrigerator, gas cook top, oven, microwave, dishwasher, garbage disposal and trash compactor
- 17. Kitchen and mudroom/office have new Caesarstone counters
- Kitchen, laundry room/half bath and mudroom/office have new waterproof luxury vinyl tile flooring
- 19. Laundry room/half bathroom off kitchen
- 20. Mud room desk has 4 USB ports for easy charging
- 21. Mud room electrical outlet for freezer
- 22. Garage has pull down stairs for accessing HVAC infrastructure in attic
- 23. 5+ inch open cell, spray foam insulation to floor deck under house. R19 value.

### Cottage/Guest House/Office (Built 2000)

- 1. All new appliances including refrigerator, electric stove and cook top, washer and dryer
- 2. Hot water on demand and mini-split HVAC systems to reduce utility costs
- New countertops and waterproof luxury vinyl tile flooring

- 1. Pendants above peninsula in kitchen
- 2. Semi-circular window above garage doors
- 3. Front hall ceiling pendant
- 4. Stairwell ceiling fixture
- 5. Mirror in laundry room/bathroom
