BY-LAWS
OF
CHAMPION FOREST FUND, INC.

## ARTICLE I

NAME AND LOCATION. The name of the Corporation is CHAMPION FOREST FUND, INC. herein referred to as the "Corportion". The principal office of the Corporation shall be located at Houston, Texas, but meetings of members and directors may be hold at such places within the state of Texas, County of Harris, as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II
DEFINITIONS
Section 1. "Corporation" shall mean and refer to Champion Forest Fund, Inc., its successors and assigns.

Section 2. "properties" shall mean and refer to that certain real property described in the Restrictions and CoveRants Governing property and Lots in Champion Forest. Section One, a subdivision in Harris County, Texas, and such additions thereto as may hereafter be brought within the jurisdiction of the Corporation ("Additional Subdivisions").

Section 3. "Common Area" shall mean all real property owned by the Corporation for the common use and enjoyment of the Owners.

Section 4. "Hot" shall mean and refer to any plot of land shown upon any recorded subdivision map of the Properties with the exception of the Common Area.

Section 5. "Owner" shall mean and refer to the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of the fee simple title to any Lot which is a part of the properties, including contract sellers, but excluding those having such interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation.

Section 6. "Declarant" shall mean and refer to Greenwood properties, Inc., a Texas corporation, its successors and assigns.

Section 7. "Declatation" shall mean and refer to the declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions applicable to the Properties recorded in the ofeice of the County clerk, Earyis County, Texas.

Section 8. "Member" shall mean and refer to those persons entitled to membership as provided in the Declaration.

ARTICLE III

## MEETING OF MEMBERS

Section 1. Annual Meetings. The Eirst annual meeting of the members shall be held on the lst of February, 1978, and each subsequent regular annual meeting of the members shall be held on the same date each year, at the hour of eight o'clock, R.M. If the day for the annual meeting of the members if

Saturday, Sunday or a legal holiday, the meeting will be held at the same hour on the first following business day.

Section 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the members may be called at any time by the president or by the Board of Directors, of upon written request of the members who are entitled to vote one-tenth of all of the votes of the class $A$ membership.

Section 3. Notice of Meeting. Written or printed notice stating the place, day and hour of the meeting, and in the case of special meetings the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, shall be delivered not less than fifteen (15) nor more than fifty (50) days before the date of the meeting either personally or by mail by or at the direction of the President or the Secretary or the officer or persons calling the meeting to each member entitled to vote at such meeting. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail addressed to the member at his address as it appears on the membership roll of the corportion, with postage thereon prepaid. Attendance by a member, whether in person or by proxy, at a membership meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting of which he has had no notice.

Section 4. Date for Determining Members. For the purpose of determining members entitled to notice of or to vote at any meeting of the membership or any adjournment thereof, or
in order to make a determination of members for any other proper purpose, the Board of Directors of the corporation shall by resolution fix in advance a date as the record date for any such determination of members, such date in any case to be not more than fifty (50) days, and in case of a meeting of the membership, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date on which the particular action requiring such determination of the members is to be taken. When a determination of members entitled to vote at any meeting of members has been made as provided in this section, such determination shall apply to any adjournment.

Section 5. Membership Rod 1. The Secretary of the corporation shall make at least fifteen (15) days before each meeting of members a complete list of the members entitled to vote at such meeting or any adjournment thereof arranged in alphabetical order, which list for a period of ten (10) days prior to such meeting shall be kept on File at the registered office of the corporation and shall be subject to inspection by any member at any time during usual business hours. Such list shall also be produced and opened at the time and place of the meeting and shall be subject to the inspection by any member during the whole time of the meeting.

Section 6. Quorum. The presence at the meeting of members entitled to cast, or of proxies entitled to cast, onetenth of the votes of each class of membership shall constitute a quorum for any action except as otherwise provided by law or in
the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration, or these ByLaws. If, however, such quorum shall not be present or represented at any meeting, the members entitled to vote shall have power to adjourn the meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the meeting, until a quorum as aforesaid shall be present or be represented.

Section 7. proxies. At all meetings of members, each member may vote in person or by proxy. All proxies shall be in writing and filed with the secretary. Every proxy shall be revocable and shall automatically cease upon conveyance by the member of his Lot.

Section 8. Voting Rights. The corporation shall have two classes of voting membership:

Class A. Class A members shall be all Owners with the exception of the Greenwood Properties, Inc. and shall be entitled to one vote for each Lot owned. When more than one person holds an interest in any Lot, all such persons shall be members. The vote for such Lot shall be exercised as they among themselves determine, but in no event shall more than one vote beacast with respect to any Lot.

Class B. The Class 8 member shall be Greenwood Properties, Inc. and shall be entitled to three (3) votes for each Lot coned. The class $B$ membership shall cease and be converted to Class A membership on the happening of either of the following events, whichever occurs earlier:
(a) when the total votes outstanding in the class A membership equal the total votes outstanding in the class B membership, or
(b) on January 1, 1984.

The Class $A$ and $B$ members shall have no rights as such to vote as a class, except as required by the Texas NonProfit Corporation Act, and both classes shall vote together upon all matters as one group.

## ARTICLE IV

BOARD OF DIRECTORS: SELECTION: TERM OF OFFICE
Section 1. Number. The affairs of this Corporation shall be managed by a Board of three (3) directors, who must all be members of the Corporation.

Section 2. Term of office. At the first annual meeting and at each annual meeting thereafter the members shall elect three directors. Each director elected shall serve until his successor shall be elected at an appropriate annual meeting of the members and shall qualify, or until his death, his resignation or his removal in the manner hereinafter provided.

Section 3. Removal. Any director may be removed from the Board, with or without cause, by a majority vote of the members of the Corporation. In the event of death, resignation or removal of a director, his successor shall be selected by the remaining members of the Board and shall serve for the unexpired term of his predecessor.

Section 4. Compensation. No director shall receive compensation for any service he may render to the corporation, However, any director may be reimbursed for his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his duties.

Section 5. Action Taken Without a Meeting. The directors shall have the right to take any action in the absence of a meeting which they could take at a meeting by obtaining the written approval of all the directors. Any action so approved shall have the same effect as though taken at a meeting of the directors.

## ARTICLE V

## NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Nomination. Nomination for election to the Board of Directors shall be made by a Nominating Committee. Nominations may also be made from the floor at the annual meeting. The Nominating Committee shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be member of the Board of Directors, and two or more members of the Corporation. The Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors prior to each annual meeting of the members, to serve from the close of such annual meeting until the close of the next annual meeting and such appointment shall be announced at each annual meeting. The Nominating Commitre shall make as many nominations for election to the Board of Directors as it shall in its discretion determine, but not
less than the number of vacancies that are to be filled. Such nominations may only be made from among members of the corportion.

Section 2. Election. Election to the Board of Directors shall be by secret written ballot. At such election the members or their proxies may cast, in respect to each vacancy, as many votes as they are entitled to exercise under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation of this corportion and the Declaration. The persons receiving the largest number of votes shall be elected.

## ARTICLE VI

## MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held quarterly without notice, at such place and hour as may be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board. Should said meeting fall upon a legal holiday, then that meeting shall be held at the same time on the next day which is not a legal holiday.

Section 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held when called by the President of the Corporation, or by any two Directors, after not less than three (3) days' notice to each Director.

Section 3. Quorum. A majority of the number of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of
the Directors present at a duly held meeting at which a quorum is present shall be regarded as the act of the Board.

## ARTICLE VII

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
Section 1. Powers. The Board of Directors shall have
power to:
(a) adopt and publish rules and regulations governing the use of the Common Area and facilities, and the personal conduct of the members and their quests thereon, and to estabWish penalties for the infraction thereof;
(b) suspend the voting rights and right to use of the recreational facilities of a member during any period in which such member shall be in default in the payment of any assessment levied by the Corporation. Such rights may also be suspended after notice and hearing, for a period not to exceed 60 days for infraction of published rules and regulations;
(c) exercise for the Corporation all powers, duties and authority vested in on delegated to this Corporation and not reserved to the membership by other provisions of these By-Laws, the Articles of Incorporation, or the Declaration;
(d) declare the office of a member of the Board of Directors to be vacant in the event such member shall be absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors; and
(e) employ a manager, an independent contractor, of such other employees as they deem necessary, and to prescribe their duties.

Section 2. Duties. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to:
(a) cause to be kept a complete record of all its acts and corporate affairs and to present a statement thereof to the members at the annual meeting of the members, or at any special meeting When such statement is requested in writing by one-fourth (1/4) of the Class $A$ members who are entitled to vote;
(b) supervise all officers, agents ana employees of the corporation and to see that their duties are properly performed;
(c) as more fully provided in the Declaration, to:
(1) fix the amount of the annual assessment against each Lot at least thirty (30) days in advance of each annual assessment period;
(2) send written notice of each assessment to every Owner subject thereto at least thirty (30) days in advance of each annual assessment period; and
(3) foreclose the lien against any property for which assessments are not paid within thirty (30) days after due date or to bring an action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay the same.
(d) issue, or to cause an appropriate officer to issue, upon demand by any person, a certificate setting forth whether or not any assessment has been paid. A reasonable charge may be made by the Board for the issuance of these certificates. If a certificate states an assessment has been paid, such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of such payment;
(e) procure and maintain adequate liability and hazard insurance on property owned by the Corporation;
(f) cause all officers or employees having fiscal responsibilities to be bonded, as it may deem appropriate;
(g) cause the Common Area to be maintained and to dictate that first priority of action and
expenditure shall go toward the continuous and diligent upkeep and maintenance of all internal esplanades. Such upkeep and maintenance shall include mowing, trimming, watering and necessary trash pick-up.

## ARTICLE VIII

OFEICERS AND THEIR DUTIES
Section 1. Enumeration of offices. The officers of this Corporation shall be a president and vice-president, who shall at all times be members of the Board of Directors, a secretary, and a treasucer, and such other officers as the Board may from time to time by resolution create.

Section 2. Election of officers. The election of officers shall take place at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following each annual meeting of the members.

Section 3. Term. The officers of this Corporation shall be elected annually by the Board and each shall hold office for one (1) year unless he shall sooner resign, or shall be removed, or otherwise disqualified to serve.

Section 4. Special Appointments. The Board may elect such other officers as the affairs of the corporation may require, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority, and perform such duties as the Board may, from time to time, determine.

Section 5. Resignation and Removal. Any officer may be removed from office with or without cause by the Board. Any officer may resign at any time giving written notice to the Board, the president or the secretary. Such resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

Section 6. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office may be filled by appointment by the Board. The officer appointed to such vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of the officer he replaces.

Section 7. Multiple offices. The offices of secrettry and treasurer may be held by the same person. No person shall simultaneously hold more than one of any of the other offices except in the case of special offices created pursuant to Section 4 of this Article.

Section 8. Duties. The duties of the officers are as follows:

## President

(a) The president shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall see that orders and resolutions of the Board are carried out; shall have authority to sign all leases, mortgages, promissory notes, deeds and other written instruments.

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## Vice-president

(b) The vice-president shall act in the place and stead of the president in the event of his absence, inability or refusal to act, and shall exercise and discharge such other duties as may be required of him by the Board.

## Secretary

(c) The secretary shall record the votes and keep the minutes of all meetings and proceeding of the Board and of the members; keep the corporate seal of the Corporation and affix it on all papers requiring said seal; serve notice of meetings of the Board and of the members; keep appropriate current records showing the members of the Corporation together with their addresses, and shall perform such other duties as required by the board.

## Treasurer

(d) The treasurer shall receive and deposit in appropriate bank accounts all monies of the Corporation and shall disburse such funds as directed by resolution of the Board of Directors; shall have authority to sign promissory notes of the Corporation; keep proper books of account; cause an annual audit of the Corporation
books to be made by a competent accountant at the completion of each fiscal years and shall prepare an annual budget and a statement of income and expenditures to be represented to the membership at its regular annual meeting, and deliver a copy of each to the members.

ARTICLE IX
COMMITTEES
The Board of Directors shall appoint a Nominating Commitre, as provided in these By-Laws, and other committees as deemed appropriate in carrying out its purpose.

## ARTICLE X

CONTRACTS, LOANS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS
Section 1. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Loans. No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the corporation, and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name, unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Directors. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 3. Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other
evidence of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Deposit. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

## ARTICLE XI

## procedure

Meetings of members and of the Board of Directors shall be conducted in accordance with the procedure as contained in Robert's Rules of Order to the extent applicable.

ARTICLE XII

## BOOKS AND RECORDS

The books, records and papers of the corporation shall at all times, during reasonable business hours, be subject to inspection by any member. The Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation and the By-Laws of the Corporation shall be available for inspection by any member at the principal office of the Corporation, where copies may be purchased at reasonable cost.

## ARTICLE XIII

ASSESSMENTS
As more fully provided in the Declaration, each member is obligated to pay to the corporation on the first day of

January of each year after 1976 annual assessments which are secured by a continuing lien upon the property against which the assessment is made. Any assessments which are not paid when due shall be delinquent and shall bear interest from the date of delinquency at the rate of ten per cent (10\%) per annam. The Corporation may bring an action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay the same or Eoreclose the lien against the property, and interest, costs, and reasonable attorney's fees of any such action shall be added to the amount of such assessment. No Owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by nonuse of the Common Area or abandonment of his Lot.

ARTICLE XIV
CORPORATE SEAL
The corporation shall have a seal in circular form with a five point star in the center and having within its circumference the words: CHMMPION FOREST FUND, INC.

ARTICLE XV
AMENDMENTS
Section 1. These By-Laws may be amended, at a regular or special meeting of the members, by a vote of a majority of a quorum of members present in person or by proxy.

Section 2. In the case of any conflict between the Articles of Incorpration and these By-Laws, the Articles shall
control; and in the case of any conflict between the Declaration and these BY-Laws, the Declaration shall control.

ARTICLE XVI
MISCELLANEOUS

The Eiscal year of the corporation shall begin on the Eirst day of January and end on the 31 st day of December of evezy Year, except that the first Elscal year shall begin on the date of incorporation.
