
Did You Know?

Community News

We've had an increase in Deed Restriction violations this year. Be sure to review yours on our website.

The Board always recommends that neighbors be notified first of any issues. Sometimes a friendly conversation solves the situation. If the violation has not been addressed after 7-10 days, then we recommend that a report be filed with the appropriate COH department. While slow, the COH does address the situations. An example is the corner lot at Clay & Tilson. While we would love to cut it ourselves, that won't solve the bigger ongoing issue of the owner's responsibility, so a report was filed in August, and the COH has pursued it since them. A citation was issued, the owner was contacted, an extension was granted, and now the COH is working on legal action including a lien and forced cut, when the City would mow the sidewalk. Using the COH resources is free and relieves our neighborhood of potentially costly legal expense. Amy Peck's office (our District rep) has been very helpful, as well.

LIBBY'S® PUMPKIN ROLL

Prep: 45 min Cook: 13 min Serves: 14

- 1/4 cup powdered sugar (to sprinkle on towel)
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3 large eggs
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 2/3 cup LIBBY'S® 100% Pure Pumpkin
- 1 cup walnuts, chopped (optional)
- 1 package (8 oz) cream cheese, room temperature)
- 1 cup powdered sugar, sifted
- 6 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Powdered sugar (optional for decoration)

Step 1

Preheat oven to 375° F. Grease 15 x 10-inch jelly-roll pan; line with wax paper. Grease and flour paper. Sprinkle a thin, cotton kitchen towel with 1/4 cup powdered sugar.

Step 2

Combine flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt in small bowl. Beat eggs and granulated sugar in large mixer bowl until thick. Beat in pumpkin. Stir in flour mixture. Spread evenly into prepared pan. Sprinkle with nuts.

Step 3

Bake for 13 to 15 minutes or until top of cake springs back when touched. (If using a dark-colored pan, begin checking for doneness at 11 minutes.) Immediately loosen and turn cake onto prepared towel. Carefully peel off paper. *Be sure to put enough powdered sugar on the towel when rolling up the cake so it will not stick.* Roll up cake and towel together, starting with narrow end. Cool on wire rack.

Step 4

Beat cream cheese, 1 cup powdered sugar, butter and vanilla extract in small mixer bowl until smooth. Carefully unroll cake. Spread cream cheese mixture over cake. Reroll cake. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate at least one hour. Sprinkle with powdered sugar before serving, if desired.



CIVIC CLUB VS HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION

What is a Civic Association?

Outpost Estates has a Civic Association (CA) which is a non-profit organization whose primary goal is to improve the quality of life in a given neighborhood through volunteer work by its members. The CA keeps up with important issues affecting the members in a neighborhood (i.e. land-use planning, improvement of infrastructure, traffic management, public safety and crime, etc.) and acts as a liaison with city agencies. Membership is voluntary. Dues are used to coordinate community events.

What is a Homeowners' Association?

A Homeowners' Association (HOA) is a non-stock corporation formed by a real estate developer for the purpose of marketing, managing, and selling lots and homes in a certain subdivision. It grants the developer control in governing the association until a certain amount of lots or homes are sold in the development. When that number of lots or homes are sold, the developer transfers legal responsibility of the organization. Membership in the HOA is mandatory; it is a condition of purchase. Dues are also mandatory. The dues are used to maintain and operate certain common areas throughout the neighborhood. Typically, there are covenants and restrictions which all members must follow.
