

Community Leadership

Strength in Numbers

With nearly 2,000 homeowners, the Spring Shadows Civic Association (SSCA) offers a wealth of amenities and services, including:

- Productive relationships with Harris County Commissioners, Houston City Council, Spring Branch Management District, and Spring Branch North Super Neighborhood
- A dedicated office and staff to support community needs and goals
- Supplemental patrol services provided by Harris County Precinct 5 Constables
- · Landscaped esplanades on major streets
- A bimonthly newsletter covering community activities and information
- A website and timely email notifications to homeowners

Commitment to Service

Serving in two-year staggered terms, 47 homeowner-elected directors manage the SSCA. Dedicated volunteer committees address areas vital to neighborhood safety, health, and sustainability:

- Patrol and safety
- Health / mosquito control
- Budget and financial planning
- Business and government relations
- Special events
- Welcoming
- Architecture (maintaining external standards)
- Beautification
- Communication / publications







Security

Spring Shadows' in-town location offers easy access to Houston's myriad amenities while maintaining levels of security comparable with those of neighborhoods many miles away from the city.

Harris County Precinct 5 Constables

Funded by residents through the Spring Shadows Civic Association (SSCA), supplementary patrol services by Harris County Precinct 5 Constables enhance security in the Spring Shadows subdivision. Spring Shadows also benefits from helpful programs available throughout Precinct 5:

- Silver Watch, where constables regularly check on participating senior citizens' welfare
- Vacation Watch, where constables keep an extra eye on things while participating residents are away

Centrally Located Fire Station

A City of Houston Fire Station adjacent to Spring Shadows provides Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) and ambulance services.

Limited Through-Traffic

Spring Shadows' layout enhances security by limiting through-traffic. Many streets end in cul-de-sacs.

A Diverse, Friendly Resident Population

Most importantly, Spring Shadows' diverse resident population supports security in several ways:

- The neighborhood includes many stay-at-home parents, professionals working from home, and retirees, all of whom can quickly spot and report potentially suspicious activity.
- Several active neighborhood interest groups and the SSCA's Special Events Committee provide opportunities for neighbors to get to know and care about one another.

Education

Public Schools – the highly regarded Spring Branch Independent School district (SBISD)

Early Learning Centers

SBISD offers exemplary full-day Pre-Kindergarten programs.

Elementary Schools

- Terrace, achieving high teacher retention rates, with many teachers and staff living nearby
- Spring Shadows, offering a social and emotional learning program based on horseback riding
- Pine Shadows, offering a program where both Spanish and English speakers achieve bilingual capability

Middle and High Schools

Spring Shadows' zoned Middle Schools include Spring Oaks, Spring Woods, and Northbrook; high schools include Spring Woods and Northbrook. Additional SBISD options include specialty schools for advanced studies as well as charter programs such as Cornerstone Academy, Westchester (international studies), YES Prep, and KIPP Courage.

Private Schools

Some private schools near Spring Shadows:

- Houston Christian High School, a prestigious faith-based institution
- The Monarch School and Institute, for students with neurological differences
- The Arbor School, for children with developmental delays







Health and Wellness

Hospitals, emergency centers, urgent care facilities, parks, and fitness centers near Spring Shadows support all aspects of residents' health and wellness.

Memorial City Medical Center

Located just three miles from Spring Shadows, Memorial Hermann Memorial City Medical Center repeatedly ranks in the top 5% of US hospitals, offering:

- More than 1,300 affiliated physicians representing 91 medical specialties
- 1,700 employees
- 444 licensed hospital beds

Emergency Centers, Urgent Care Facilities, and Neighborhood EMTs

- With staffing and services comparable to those of hospital emergency rooms, area emergency centers include Sacred Heart Emergency Center and SignatureCare Emergency Center.
- Area urgent care facilities, suitable for minor conditions, include enTrust Immediate Care and Texas Children's Urgent Care.
- City of Houston Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) provide rapid response services from a command center in the heart of Spring Shadows.

Parks and Green Spaces

Agnes Moffitt Park, Campbell Woods Park, the Emnora Lane Hike & Bike Trail, and many other area parks and green spaces provide opportunities for jogging, biking, swimming, and other healthy activities.

- Highest-quality office space




CITYCENTRE, a planned community, includes:

Memorial City







Neighborhood Restaurants
