Montrose is a neighborhood located in the Houston, Texas zip code 77006. The four square mile region that comprises Montrose was built in 1911, and it is a cornerstone of diversity in the middle of a metropolis that never stops entertaining.

Residents of Montrose enjoy a pedestrian-friendly neighborhood, abundant greenspaces, community gardens, and dog parks.

Montrose residents call it a “little town” of its own. Montrose has always attracted people who are creative, social, and value diversity in their community. Artists, performers, community organizations, art galleries with free entry, and streets lined with lush trees are highlights of this neighborhood.

More than 209,000 students attend schools within the Houston ISD. The Montrose area is well-known for its vibrant mix of art, history, and culture. Both Houston natives and visitors flock to Montrose to experience old-world architecture, handcrafted goods, amazing food, and an unparalleled cultural scene.

The famous Menil Collection is a free art museum in the Montrose community that spans five different buildings and features works in a wide variety of artistic genres and media. The grounds also include a bistro and 30-acres of shaded, oak-lined landscaping that are open to the public.
