## NOTICE TO PURCHASER OF SPECIAL TAXING OR ASSESSMENT DISTRICT

## POINT AQUARIUS MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

The real property that you are about to purchase is located in POINT AQUARIUS MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT and may be subject to district taxes or assessments. The district may, subject to voter approval, impose taxes and issue bonds. The district may impose an unlimited rate of tax in payment of such bonds.

The current rate of the district property tax is \$0.43 on each \$100 of assessed valuation.

The total amounts of bonds payable wholly or partly from property taxes, excluding refunding bonds that are separately approved by the voters and excluding any bonds or any portions of bonds issued that are payable solely from revenues received or expected to be received under a contract with a governmental entity, approved by voters are:

\$21,000,000 for water, sewer, and drainage facilities; and \$0.00 for road facilities; and \$0.00 for parks and recreational facilities.

The aggregate initial principal amounts of all such bonds issued are:

\$16,800,000 for water, sewer, and drainage facilities; and \$0.00 for road facilities; and \$0.00 for parks and recreational facilities.

The District has the authority to adopt and impose a standby fee on property in the District that has water, sanitary sewer or drainage facilities and services available but not connected and which does not have a house, building, or other improvement located thereon and does not substantially utilize the utility capacity available to the property. The District may exercise the authority without holding an election on the matter. The amount of the standby fee is \$7.50. An unpaid standby fee is a personal obligation of the person that owned the property at the time of imposition and is secured by a lien on the property. Any person may request a certificate from the district stating the amount, if any, of unpaid standby fees on a tract of property in the district.

The district is located wholly or partly in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Conroe. Texas law governs the ability of a municipality to annex property in the municipality's extraterritorial jurisdiction and whether a district that is annexed by the municipality is dissolved.

The purpose of the district is to provide water, sewer, drainage, flood control, or other types of facilities and services. The cost of district facilities is not included in the purchase price of your property.
