Stanka Agin Grocery Store & Dwelling 827 Winnie North Part Lot 1/ Block 308 (also known as Lot A/ Druss Subdivision) Built 1906 Remodeled 1927

The 1920s era insurance record for 827 Winnie described a two-story frame building on the north part of lot 1, block 308, identified as 825-827 Avenue G (Winnie). The building contained ten rooms, two halls, two bathrooms, two closets and three porches. When the record was completed, the building was used as tenant property by the owner, Mrs. F. H. (Bertha) Sage. Undated amendments note the building was divided into two apartments and eventually noted as a tri-plex that supported three families. Bertha Sage and her husband, Fredrick Sage, purchased the property in December 1919 from Mrs. Stanka Agin, widow of George Agin.

George and Stanka Agin were Austrian immigrants who arrived in Galveston in 1888. After they arrived, George Akin worked as a grocery clerk for Peter Quarternik before he established his own grocery on the southeast corner of Winnie and 9<sup>th</sup> Street in 1893. City directory advertisements noted Agin sold groceries, beer and oysters from the corner store. When the 1900 Storm struck on September 8<sup>th</sup>, the Agin corner store was destroyed and George drowned, along with two of the couple's three children.

After the hurricane, Stanka built a small one-story building on the corner lot and utilized it as her corner grocery and residence. In 1906, Stanka contracted to have the current two-story building erected and connected to the one-story building built after the Great Storm. After the current building was completed, Stanka operated a corner store from the first floor. The 1908 directory also noted the presence of a saloon in the building. Stanka operated her businesses from the corner of 9<sup>th</sup> and Winnie through 1917. In 1919, she sold the property to Frederic and Bertha Sage. After she sold to the Sages, Stanka eventually relocated to San Antonio where she resided with her son, Dr. George Agin.

Frederic Hebard Sage was a steamship agent born in 1859 in Manhattan. In 1898, Sage married Bertha Preston, born in Navasota, Texas, in 1874. The couple resided in Galveston by 1900 when the United States census recorded their residence at 3205 Avenue P. After the 1900 Storm, the Sages relocated to 1611 Church Street, where they resided in 1919 when they purchased the Agin Corner Store at 827 Winnie. After they acquired the property, they utilized it as tenant property. In 1923, they relocated the one-story building to the west part of lot two (823 Winnie) and in 1927, they remodeled the two-story corner store building and are likely the owners responsible for the division into apartments.

After Fredrick's death in 1922, Bertha maintained ownership until 1929 when she sold the lots to Joe Druss who subdivided the lots into independent parcels renamed Druss Subdivision. Druss was born in Russia in 1880 and immigrated to Galveston in 1910 where he found employment as a retail clothing merchant. After he bought the two lots on Winnie, he continued to utilize 827 Winnie (as well as the other buildings on the lot) as rent property. In 1946, Druss sold 827 Winnie, located on Lot A of Druss Subdivision, to Jack Telford who transferred ownership the same year to Franks Bonte. Bonte was the first owner to occupy the residence since Stanka Agin.

The next two owners after Bonte, Joe and Carmen Cruz and Pedro and Natividad Tejeda, utilized the property as their personal residence. The Tejeda family occupied the house with the longest tenure of thirty-eight years. Pedro Tejeda was born in Honduras in 1911. As a young man, he relocated to Galveston where he met Natividad DeLeon, born in Mexico in 1921. Tejada worked as a merchant seaman and was a member of the National Maritime Union and a veteran of World War II. After Natividad's death in 1980, Pedro maintained the family home on the corner of 9<sup>th</sup> and Winnie. He retained ownership until 1998 and in 2003, he passed away at a local nursing home.

After the Tejeda family, ownership of 827 Winnie changed several more times with use reverting back to investment property. The current owner acquired the building in 2022. The Stanka Agin Corner Store and Residence is located on the east end of Galveston Island in a neighborhood sometimes referred to as University Park.





## Sanborn Fire Insurance Map Footprints, lot 1/ block 308-827 Winnie



The 1912 Sanborn Map recorded five buildings on Stanka Agin's two lots and included the corner store at 827 Winnie. The map identified the store as a two-story frame dwelling and corner store identified by a traditional wood canopy that framed the store's entrance and protected patrons from the elements. South of but connected to the corner store is the one-story building erected by Stanka in December 1900 and originally used as her place of business.



The 1947 map recorded the relocation of the one-story 1900 building to 823 Winnie as well as the absence of the traditional corner store canopy and the addition of a one-story porch on the north elevation of 827 Winnie, noted as a dwelling.
