Sanborn maps show current house footprint existed in 1912 after surviving the 1900 Storm.



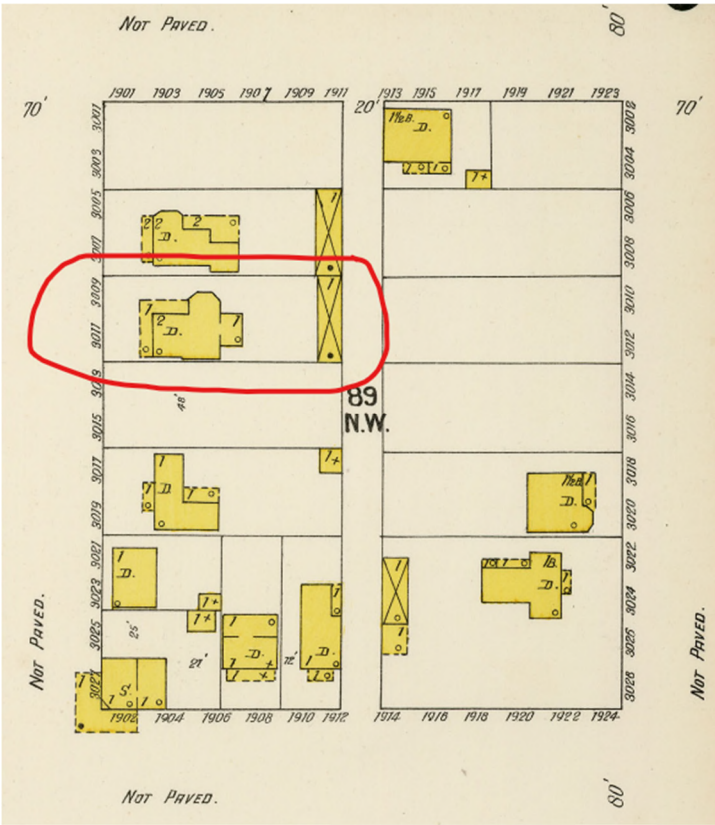

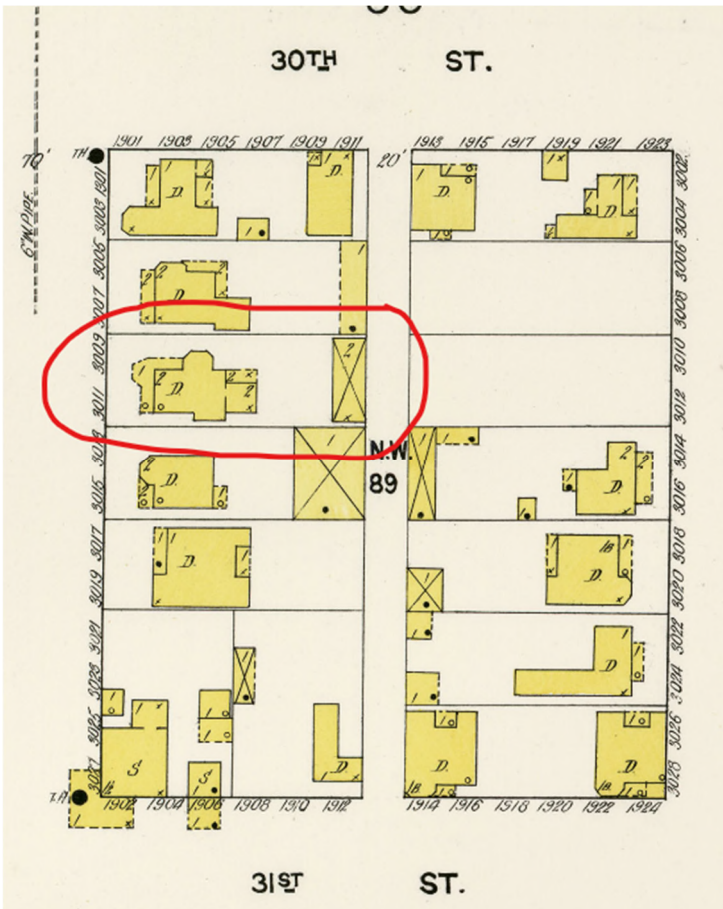
Current photo of fully renovated Historic Home and recognized 1900 Storm Survivor.
