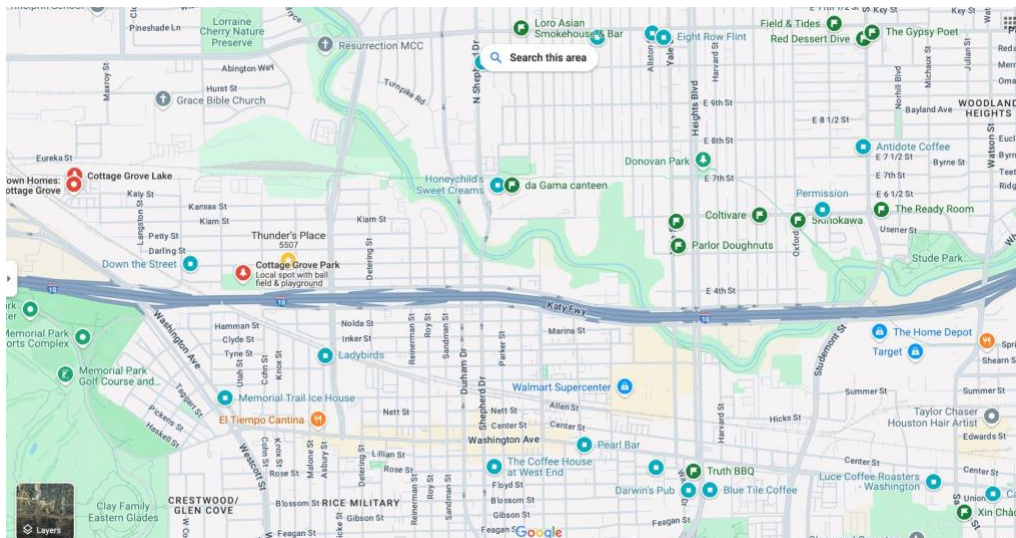

History

The Bankers Trust Company established Cottage Grove as a suburb of Houston around 1910. It was originally an independent city and a rail stop for the Eureka Junction of the Houston and Texas Central Railway. The neighborhood got its name from the hundreds of cottages built during the 1920's and 1930's.

Location

Cottage Grove is in Houston's Inner Loop, north of Washington Corridor and west of The Heights. It's close to Memorial Park, one of Houston's largest urban parks, and the Katy Freeway.



Homes

Cottage Grove has a mix of vintage cottages, new construction homes, townhomes, and apartment complexes. The neighborhood is known for its unique homes on large lots surrounded by large pine trees.

Amenities

Cottage Grove is pedestrian-friendly and has a variety of amenities. The White Oak Bayou Greenway connects to the neighborhood's tracks and offers a commuter path.

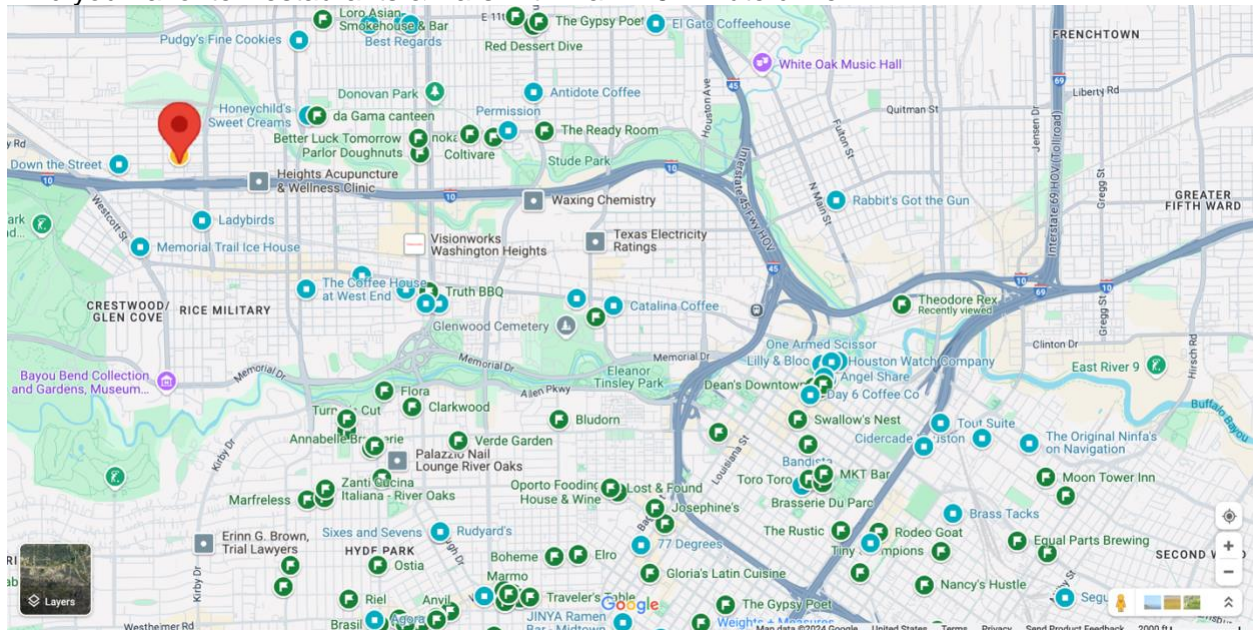

Nearby attractions

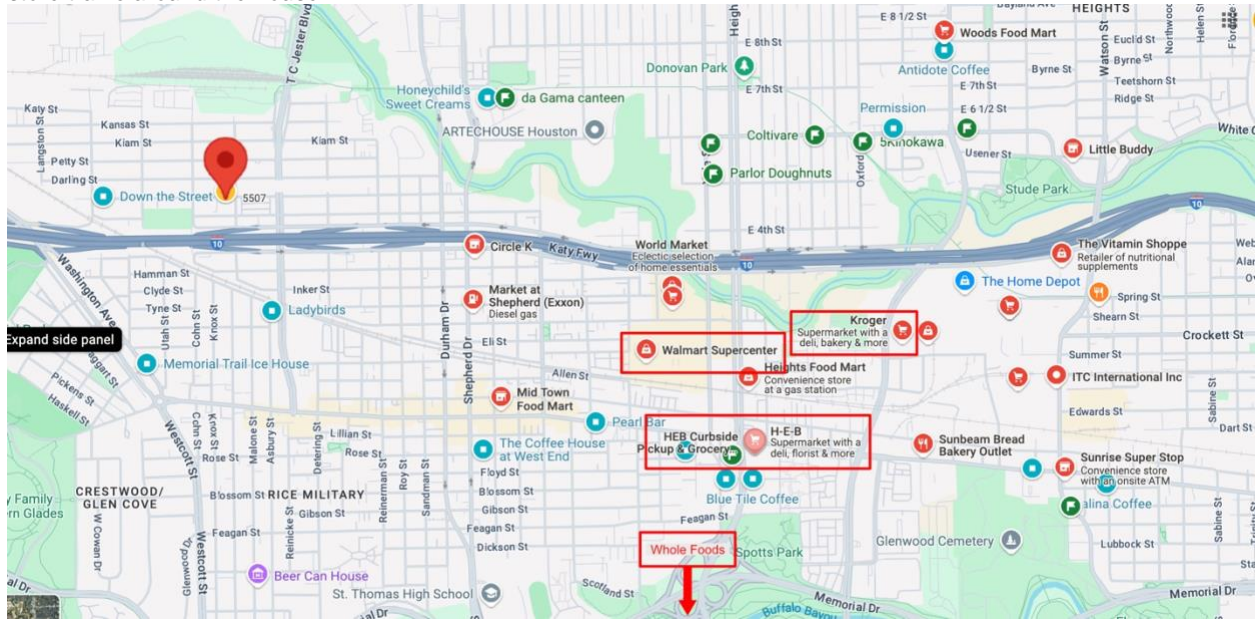
Cottage Grove is close to Downtown Houston, The Galleria, Uptown Park, Memorial Park, and the Washington Corridor.
